These courses are taught by informed trainers who know how to engage groups and make learning fun. Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster Specific shows you how to teach boys to lead their own Troop. This course may be presented in one six-hour session or in three shorter sessions on different days.

The three sessions will cover:

- The role of a Scoutmaster in a Boy-Led troop
- Lighting the Fire: The Outdoor Program and the Advancement Program
- Keeping it going: Program Planning and Troop Administration

In addition, each session provides training specific to that leader position. If you are entering a different position in the Troop, attend the Position Specific Training for that position.
