

Guide for BSA Training Expiration

Certain BSA training has an expiration date, for example "Youth Protection" expires 2 years after you complete the training and receive your certificate. The following guide is from National Council and is believed to be complete and accurate. Remember that the absolute proof of your training is your training card/certificate, so remember to keep them safe and accounted for.
