Once Council approves the Application, Council will mail it back to the Troop's Scoutmaster. · During this initial Council Approval, Council is only checking to make sure that all of the dates and data that is listed are correct and that the application has been filled out and signed. Complete first the General Information at the top of the first page down to Requirement 1, except for the blue shaded area marked For Council Use Only. Fill in the date for Requirement #1 Requirement# 2 The Scout must list at least five people as references. This must be filled in completely including name, address, telephone number and e-mail address. • The Scout will then send each of these people on the list the attached reference letter.


o The person listed should complete the reference letter and mail it back to the Troop

Committee Chair or Troop Advancement Chair.

That way the Troop Chair receiving the letter will know who it for and what it is for so that they do not open them. o These Letters ARE NOT sent to Council with the Eagle Application in Step #1 above... o The Application is turned into Council for the preliminary approval that I mentioned above WITHOUT these letters. Complete the entire area regarding Merit Badges. If your troop does not have these records,



AT THIS POINT, the Application is ready to be submitted to Council for approval as stated in St

Once Council approves the Eagle Application and returns it to the Troop Scoutmaster, the Eagle Scout Board of Review can take place.
· The Troop Committee Chair or Troop Advancement Chair organizes the Eagle Board of review.
1. First they must make certain that they have the approved signed Eagle Application returned from Council.
2. And they also have to have all of the letters from Requirement #2 of the application unopened and ready for the EBOR.
3. Finally they have to have the Scout's statement of life's ambitions from Requirement #6.
The Troop Committee / Advancement Chair then contacts me with a choice of dates / times and the location of the EBOR.
