

→ How Cub Scouting Works

The mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law.

- Your child is a member of a **DEN**, consisting of 5-8 children, similar in age who typically meet once a week with a Den Leader, usually a parent.
- All of the DENS (Scouts from grades K-5) make up the PACK.
- The PACK meets once a month with the Cubmaster, with all the other DENS in attendance. At the **PACK** meeting, you will have fun activities and have the opportunity to engage with other **DENS**.
- Your PACK is part of the Dan Beard Council, Boy Scouts of America, which serves on average over 20,000 youth & families in Greater Cincinnati & Northern Kentucky.

Long-term Scouts are nearly twice as likely as non-scouts to **graduate from college.**




Scouts are more likely to be active in a group that works to **protect the environment** than non-scouts.

Cub Scout Pack Organization



Pack Committee

The Pack Committee members perform administrative functions for the Cub Scout Pack.



Chartered Organization Representative

The Chartered Organization Representative is the direct contact between the Scouting unit and the chartered organization (typically your church, school or service club).



Committee Chair

The Committee Chair presides over all Pack Committee meetings. They help recruit adult leaders and lead the Pack.



Cubmaster

The Cubmaster helps plan and carry out the Pack program with the help of the Pack Committee. They also emcee the monthly Pack meeting and attend the Pack Leaders' meeting.



Den Leader

The Den Leader leads the Den at weekly Den and monthly Pack meetings. They also attend the monthly Pack Leaders' meeting.

Scouting's Commitment to Safety

The safety of our youth, families, volunteers, and staff is the most important part of the Scouting experience. Learning by doing is a hallmark of outdoor education. Scouting offers youth the chance to learn new life skills in a safe, supportive environment that is free from judgment, and where risks are identified and mitigated. Along the way they acquire skills that make them more self-reliant, stronger leaders, and better able to achieve their goals.

The Scouting program, as contained in our handbooks and literature, integrates many safety features. These include everything from guidelines for safe activities to protecting youth from any form of abuse, including bullying.

The Boy Scouts of America has established a multi-tiered youth protection approach focused on volunteer screening, education, clear policies, and training for everyone in the program. The BSA is recognized as having some of the strongest barriers to child abuse found in any youth-serving organization. Just a few of these include: ongoing required youth protection training, a formal volunteer selection process that includes criminal background checks, prohibiting one-on-one contact between adults and youth members, and a volunteer screening database.

Learn About Training & Youth Protection Training

Scouting is a volunteer led program and Dan Beard Council has the training and tools to help you along the way. Training will give you fresh ideas, a place to talk to other Scout parents, and the knowledge and information you need to carry out the Scouting program. The required trainings needed to be a Cub Leader are available at My.Scouting.org. There are numerous online trainings in the BSA Learn Center, referenced below.

We take youth protection very seriously. Youth Protection Training is required for all Scout Leaders and adults accompanying youth at events. All volunteers are required to have current Youth Protection Training to participate in Scouting. Leaders with expired Youth Protection Training will be unable to participate until renewed. Youth Protection Training must be renewed every 2 years. Learn more about Youth Protection at DanBeard.org/YouthProtection.

How to complete Youth Protection Training?

- **1.)** Visit **My.Scouting.org** and click "create an account." You will receive a temporary ID number to proceed.
- **2.)** Once logged in, click the **Youth Protection Training** icon (on the right side) to access the BSA Learn Center.
- **3.)** Scroll down and click Youth Protection Training. Click Enroll button then follow the links to start the modules.

^{*}Note: If you are registering as an adult, your BSA Membership ID # will be issued after you complete training and turn in your Adult Application. Print out a copy of your Youth Protection Certificate and turn it in with your Adult Application.
