This Silver Beaver Award Nomination Form (Form) is to be used in the nomination process for new Dan Beard Council Silver Beavers in 2025. This Form requires detailed information in the areas of (1) Service, Training and Recognition data; (2) new standards for reference letters (see below); and (3) examples of **beneficial and impactful service** to youth in the Dan Beard Council (see below).



Without sufficient and current information, the Selection Committee will be unable to properly assess the nominee's commitments and contributions to our movement and community.



Nominator's may contact Front Desk personnel at the Scout Achievement Center (513-577-7700) to determine if the Council has additional nominee data in the areas of Service, Training and Recognition. This database source has proven to be helpful in the past in adding to information secured by nominators. Please allow at least 1 week for the records to be gathered and shared. We cannot promise that staff will be able to handle last-minute requests.

Reference Letters - The Selection Committee now requires no less than two and no more than three letters from nominee supporters.

At the bottom of page two of the Form, please provide examples of exceptional commitment and service to the youth of our community. As this is a highly competitive Award process, this specific information is an important factor in the overall decision-making process.

RULES AND REGULATIONS of the BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Article X, Section 6, Clause 3
Silver Beaver Award

The Boy Scouts of America, acting through the National Court of Honor, may award the Silver Beaver for distinguished service to youth upon the following basis and procedure:

- Each local council may process their own annual allotment of Silver Beaver awards and shall send a list of Silver Beaver recipients presented each calendar year to the National Court of Honor no later than January 31 of the following year.
- The award is made for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters within the territory under the jurisdiction of a local council.
- c) As evidence of the award there shall be presented: a suitable certificate, duly authenticated by the Boy Scouts of America, pursuant to the action of the National Court of Honor; and a miniature Silver Beaver suspended by a blue, white, and blue ribbon to be worn around the neck.
- d) It shall be a general policy that no public announcements shall be made by the local council in advance of action by the National Court of Honor with reference to names presented for consideration.
- e) These awards shall be made to the recipients by the local council concerned in connection with its annual meeting or other public location.
- f) Each duly chartered local council shall be entitled to one nomination. Councils having more than 60 units shall be entitled to further nominations on the basis of one for each additional 60 units or fraction thereof in their territory, as of December 31 preceding the nomination, according to the records of the national office.
- g) Councils not using their full allotment in any year may accumulate the unused portion for use in any subsequent year.
- h) In extraordinary cases, the Silver Beaver Award may be made by the National Court of Honor to a Scouter upon the recommendation of the duly constituted Scouting authorities having supervision of one or more units of the Boy Scouts of America, located outside of the United States and not under the jurisdiction of a local council.

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
